WELCOME TO MASS: Christ is risen! Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia! The great event of Christ's Resurrection is marked by the powerful and dramatic Easter Vigil when the new fire, kindled after dark, is blessed and used to light the new Paschal candle, the symbol of the Risen Jesus. This is the night above all others, in which our own hope of resurrection dawned. The Masses and Liturgies of Palm Sunday, Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday are steeped in well over 1500 years of tradition, and, in essence, remain unchanged. This reflects the unchanging nature of the Gospel, the revelation of God's constant love shown in the painful, dramatic and exhilarating events of Holy Week.

THIS WEEK—EASTER VIGIL and EASTER DAY. We come to

rejoice at Christ's rising, and do so through fire, light, Holy Scripture, water, and renewing our baptismal vows, by which we are set on the road to salvation.

HOLY COMMUNION: If you are not a Roman Catholic, a member of a church in full communion with it, or an Orthodox unable to attend an Orthodox Liturgy, you are warmly invited to come forward for a blessing at the time of Holy Communion. Holy Communion cannot be given to all, as it is for us the sign of unity in the faith. Communion is not bread and wine, but the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of God the Son. Let us pray for true unity among all Christians, as God wills. Blessed be Jesus in the most Holy Sacrament of the Altar!



## ARRANGING A BAPTISM

Congratulations on the birth of your baby! First, parents must begin the process by seeing Fr Stephen *in person* at a Sunday Mass. He can then check a few simple facts and give out a baptism application form. We do not deal with initial arrangements by phone, email or through other members of the family, but face to face. Parents need to attend a preparation session before the baptism can take place.

**Congratulations on your engagement!** To arrange a wedding, an initial meeting with Fr Stephen is vital so that the canonical and civil processes can be correctly followed. Couples need to give at least six months' notice.
