Dear Parishioners,

Next Saturday is the Feast of St Joseph the Worker.

If you are thinking that it seems only a few weeks since we celebrated the Feast of St Joseph, you are not mistaken. St Joseph's primary feast day is 19th March, so why does he have a second?

Pope Pius XII very deliberately chose 1st May to venerate St Joseph in response to the 'May Day' celebrations for workers sponsored by Communists. This feast extends the long relationship between St Joseph and the cause of workers in both Catholic faith and devotion. Whilst celebrating the dignity of human work the Church points to Jesus' foster father, who as a carpenter is an example of the holiness of human labour. So, this coming Saturday is an opportunity to reflect on the dignity of work, as well as an opportunity to again consider this Holy man, especially during this year which Pope Francis has dedicated to Mary's spouse.

Other than his profession, we don't know much about St Joseph. He was the chaste husband of Mary and the foster father of Jesus, who came from the royal lineage of King David. We can see from his actions in scripture that St Joseph was a compassionate man and obedient to the will of God. He also loved Mary and Jesus and wanted to protect and provide for them.

He is a wonderful saint for us to both imitate and call upon his intercession. This is especially true when we consider that St Joseph is the patron of many things, including the universal Church, fathers, the dying and social justice.
