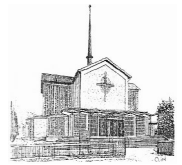

Dear Parishioners,

There are two very welcome Bank Holiday Mondays in May. Having said this when Monday is a free day, I spend the rest of the week trying to work out what day it is and why I seem to have less time than usual! Next week on the first Monday of May the Church invites us to commemorate this day off by celebrating the Feast of St Joseph the Worker. We celebrate our work with a day off. I like that! The next Bank Holiday comes at the end of the month and is part of Whitsun.

St Joseph was a carpenter by trade. He was foster father of Jesus and Husband of Mary. He earned a good living by working with wood. Having visited Israel a few years ago I do not remember many trees so I would imagine the raw materials arrived by boat. We can imagine Jesus finding his way into the carpenter's shop to play with the curls of wood shavings, sawdust, to watch his dad at work or even to help. There is something very satisfying working with wood especially if it has been properly dried.

It is thought Joseph's carpenter's shop was well known in Nazareth where Jesus was brought up. If you wanted a repair or something made for the home or work, you would probably need to go to a carpenter to make it for you in which case I think we could say that Joseph was more than a carpenter, he was a craftsman. It is said that Joseph had a particular specialism, and this was advertised on a sign outside his shop. This was a picture of a yoke together with the words "my yoke is easy". A yoke was the piece of wood which rested across the shoulders of the person carrying a heavy load. Used for carrying buckets of water, bricks or rocks it made the weight easier to carry. Split that load in two and balance it across the shoulders and the load becomes much easier to carry and more comfortable for the carrier. The key is the yoke. When Jesus spoke to the crowds, we know he used examples and illustrations drawn from daily life. When Jesus said, "My yoke is easy and my burden light!" people immediately knew he was referring to the sign outside Joseph's carpenter's shop and everybody understood what he meant.

Jesus tells us he can share a heavy load with us, and no load is too heavy when there are two or more people helping to share the weight. We know from our own experiences how we are often weighed down by burdens, troubles, and worries. We struggle under their heavy load and we can easily forget to ask for help. I wonder when did you last turn to Jesus and ask his help? Be ready for a big surprise when you do because Jesus can still work a miracle when we ask for support.

In our prayers this weekend let us ask for the intercession of St Joseph if we are weighed down with problems. When the problems of the world are on your shoulders don't forget to ask Jesus to help to carry your burden. You may recall Simon of Cyrene did the same for Jesus on the road to Calvary and when we see people struggling, perhaps we might offer to help them too.
