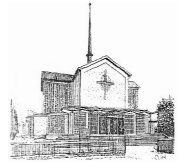

Dear Parishioners,

One of my responsibilities in the Parish is to be the Chaplain to St. Anthony's Primary School and St Patrick's Primary School. Over the last year this has become one of my favourite parts of Parish life.

We are so blessed to have four excellent primary schools in our Parish.

In this Sunday's Gospel we hear how the Apostles were sent out by Jesus on Mission. They went to form Disciples. This is a task that we are responsible for in our own day and age. There are many ways we do this within our Parishes, but one of the most important means of forming Disciples is through our excellent schools. These schools are contributing to the Mission of the our Parishes in an invaluable way.

I would like to invite you to consider if you could contribute towards the work of our schools as a governor.

First let me dispel some false notions of what it is to be a school governor.

Governors are not involved in the day-to-day management of the school. Rather, they help form a strategic vision and hold the school's leadership to account. To be a governor you do not need to have prior experience in the field of education, although such experience may be helpful. What you do need is a willingness to take part in training and the time to attend meetings and read the relevant papers.

This is such an important role in the life of our schools, and therefore the life of our parishes.

I would like to invite you to consider if you could potentially be a school governor.

As chaplain to St Anthony's and St Patrick's, both of which have a serious need of new governors, I would invite you to contact me to simply have a conversation as to whether this is something you could do. There is no expectation on my part that this means you will become a governor, so please don't hesitate to speak to me.
