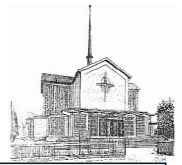

Dear Parishioners,

I hope you are keeping well? The clocks go back this weekend which means an extra hour in bed for some. Speaking of masses at St Peter's and Our Lady's there are no plans at the moment to make any changes to the schedule. Our summer timetable will become our winter timetable for the moment.

This weekend we celebrate All Saints Day on Sunday. The hymn "For All the Saints" is a great rip-roaring celebration of the Saints with 8 verses of prayer and praise ending with our Christian word for joy Alleluia!!

"The Saints have no need of honour from us; neither does our devotion add the slightest thing to what is theirs. Clearly when we venerate their memory, it serves us, not them.....Calling the Saints to mind inspires, or rather arouses in us, above all else, a longing to enjoy their company, so desirable in itself. We long to share in the citizenship of heaven, to dwell with the spirits of the Blessed, to join the assembly of the patriarchs, the ranks of the prophets, the council of the apostles, the great host of martyrs, the noble company of confessors and the choirs of virgins. In short, we long to be united in happiness with all the saints.....We must seek the world which is above and set our mind on the things of heaven..... We should not only want to be with the saints, we should also hope to possess their happiness.... we must above all seek the prayers of the Saints. What is beyond our power to obtain will be granted through their intercession." (From a sermon of St Bernard of Clairvaux 1090-1153)

Personally I thought the quality of the air in Leamington improved as the returning planes to Birmingham airport stopped coming into land over our town.
