Dear Parishioners,

I hope you are keeping well.

On Tuesday the Clergy of the Warwick Deanery will be having their first meeting of 2022. The Parishes in the Deanery are: St Peter's - Leamington, Our Lady's - Lillington, St Joseph's - Whitnash, St Mary Immaculate - Warwick, St Charles Borromeo - Hampton - on - Hill, Our Lady and St Wulstan - Southam, St Anne - Wappenbury, Our Lady of the Angels - Princethorpe, St Francis of Assisi - Kenilworth, St Augustine - Kenilworth, St Gregory's - Stratford - upon - Avon, Our Lady of Peace and Blessed Robert Dibdale - Shotton, Our Lady and St Benedict - Wootton Wawen & Henley in Arden, St Francis of Assisi - Baddesley Clinton, Blessed Robert Grissold - Balsall Common. Nearly every parish has a school

These are the parishes which belong to our local Deanery family. Changes are afoot because some Deaneries throughout the Diocese either have or are in the process of amalgamating with their neighbours. The aim of amalgamation is to aid pastoral planning and help administration. One of the discussion points which many of you have commented on in your responses to the Synod Questionnaire is to allow the Clergy to do what they are trained for ie to celebrate the Sacraments and look after the spiritual needs of the parishioners but also to see a greater involvement of lay people in the responsibility for Parish administration. With the support of the Diocese most of the Clergy are more than happy for this to occur. Priests should not be dealing with the upkeep and maintenance of buildings, plant, finances and estate concerns and far too often we are too bogged down with all of this and so unable to do what we should really be doing which is to lead the spiritual life of the community and be true shepherds of their flock. In what we all hope is this post-pandemic time, we seek to rebuild our Parish communities. Most Parishes have seen a 50% drop in the number of regular attenders at Mass. This has affected Parish income and our ability to maintain buildings and provide a proper service to the community. Now I am sounding like an administrator! Really this should not be a concern for Clergy. This year of 2022 St Peter's celebrates a milestone in our Parish history. The mission was founded in 1822 so this year we celebrate our Bicentenary! I am not quite sure of the time of year when it all started. Fr Bartholomew Crosbie was already working at Wappenbury, and the bishop asked him to

Their needs were met by an ever-growing service community for their houses, transport, entertainment, shops and so on. Such a community brought their families to live in this area. Many of our local roads reflect the names of the well to do. This was before the mainline railway had arrived and at that time in the 1820's the town as we know it had not been built. Our first St Peter's Church was built in 1826 and still stands in George Street. It is a fine building but sadly soon proved to be too small. The Catholic community in Leamington never stopped growing. I will share some more nuggets about our local Catholic history over the next few months for the benefit of those who are new to our Parish or who like me take an interest in local history. I would welcome some help to arrange a few special events and Mass and to put together a commemorative magazine for this special occasion. If you would like to help just drop me a line by email or post and we can start to sort something out.
