Dear Parishioners,

I hope you are well.

This week all the Priests from Catholic Leamington will be attending an all day conference under the umbrella title of Diocesan Formation to hear about developments in safeguarding. The protection of children and vulnerable adults is a matter which is taken very seriously by all of us and especially those who are dealing with these situations on a daily basis.

The various Sacramental programmes are moving on in our five Primary Schools and the Catechism class in Catholic Leamington. The children who will be making their First Holy Communion this year are preparing for the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Our schools meet the needs of our Catholic children and help parents in their task of teaching the Catholic Faith by word and example. The Pandemic has made it difficult for the vulnerable to attend Mass and the children have been unable to experience Mass except via Live-Stream which means they attend Mass from their desks in the classroom or at home. Let us remember to pray for the children who are preparing to receive the Sacraments this year.

Further to my explanation of Warwick Deanery we had a good meeting last week. I invited Paul Milton our Deacon in training. Sr. Felicity from Baddesley Clinton came to tell us about two new icons of the Warwick Martyrs—St. John Sugar and Blessed Robert Grissold. St. John Sugar was a Priest who ministered in our area and Blessed Robert Grissold, a lay man who assisted Fr. John. Robert was described as a farmer. Sr. Felicity is in the process of painting an icon of both Martyrs. We hope the two icons will be blessed by the Bishop, included in the pilgrimage to the place of execution and taken to each Church in the Deanery for prayer.

The Clergy decided to reply individually in response to the Synodal Pathway. There are so many differing views among us that it was felt to be too difficult to prepare a single document.

The Churches of St. Francis of Assisi in Kenilworth and St. Joseph's here in Whitnash remain closed at the moment. In Kenilworth a leaking gas pipe lurks beneath the Narthex. This has been isolated and a new pipe will be installed around the building. St. Joseph's has had to be cleaned of carbon deposits from the recent fire at a cost of £27,500. This will come out of the insurance. Once this is done the Church can be re-opened but there will not be any heating as this has to be repaired.

The day I returned from our Deanery meeting Canon Paul Fitzpatrick, the Episcopal Vicar for the Churches in the Southern Area of the Archdiocese, informed me our Deanery is to be enlarged with 4 Churches from the Rugby Deanery. The Nuneaton Churches
