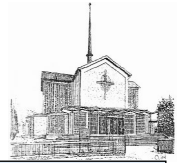

St Peter's & Our Lady's

Dear Parishioners,

I hope this letter finds you well. Sadly this week I have suffered with my first cold in two years which meant I missed the Deanery Meeting and the lunch. About 10 clergy were able to attend as well as a deacon who works at JLR and Paul our own deacon in training. The news is our Warwick Deanery is to grow even larger. Canon Paul Fitzpatrick informed the clergy that the Banbury Deanery which has only 4 parishes has voted to join Warwick and Rugby. The new mega Deanery (Warwick & Rugby, Banbury and Bicester or WARBAB) will require a new Dean, so perhaps someone else might take on this responsibility.

This week, all the hedges around St Peter's Presbytery and Church were trimmed. It took 4 workers three days to complete the task. They have removed all the cuttings too. The hedge can now be more easily maintained. It has also brought much more daylight into the house. The traffic queues are as bad as ever, so if you need to travel in the direction of the Shires, you will need to add at least 15 minutes to your journey. Worst affected roads are Dale Street, Dormer Place, the Parade, Clement Street, and all roads turning into them. Every time I go out on a visit, on my return I have to inch along in the traffic queue outside the Church and Presbytery and each time I do, I say to myself, "at least the hedges look nice!" Many thanks for your generous donations to the Cafod appeal for relief in the Ukraine last weekend. I added the Sunday collection from St Peter's & Our Lady's so the total was about £1,800. I didn't include the standing orders. We are still buying goods from the impromptu Ash Wednesday collection. A huge amount went last Saturday from the Polish Centre, there was enough for 3 HGV full loads. Last week we purchased first aid kits, torches, mess tins, cutlery, fire-lighters, fleeces, thermal wear. As previously, the shop keepers were extremely generous with their discounts, so we still have a fair amount of cash to spend on the purchase of relief items.

This weekend, following the Cafod Family Fast Day last Friday (many thanks to organisers, cooks, and diners) the Cafod representatives will be saying a few words at each Mass about the aid work undertaken by Cafod in Sierra Leone and the collection to help to alleviate the poverty in this region. The Cafod envelopes are at the entrance of the churches and can be used for the second collection on Sunday or during Lent.

St. Peter's Maintenance News: This year we plan to have the outside of the West end of the Church repaired. Some years ago we had a section of stone banding come down, along with unusual movement in the brickwork we have decided that this year we will replace the piece of stone banding which broke off, investigate the movement of the brickwork, repoint the stone, brickwork and the coping stones. There will need to be scaffolding up during this work and we plan to carry it out after the summer holidays. The cost of the works will be £13,274.40.
