# **LENT 2023**

# In St Peter's and Our Lady's

**ENT** begins on 22 February, Ash Wednesday. These forty days before Easter are kept to help us grow as Christians through works of fasting, prayer, almsgiving and penitence. In receiving the ashes we signify our understanding of ourselves as creatures, who need the grace and mercy of our Creator. The world is not all about us, our needs, our wants, our ambitions, our success. It is about this Creator who calls us into being so that He might love us and that we might serve Him and be saved by Him. That salvation comes though Jesus Christ. Like Him, we are called to defeat the devil, to stay close to the Father, and to serve others. Unlike Him, however, we are also called to repentance for it is in naming sin and asking His mercy that we refuse to be led astray by the devil and draw close to Christ for forgiveness that we might come closer still.

Lent means spring: as the earth begins to show the shoots of new life so in encouraging the shoots of a spiritual life we become evermore ready to celebrate and share in the new life of the Resurrection, the life we proclaim every Easter.

### 'CHRIST IN THE HOME': SOMETHING DIFFERENT

With both our churches suffering heating problems, holy hours in church may be very cold. But the idea of 'Christ in the Home' is that the Blessed Sacrament is taken to parishioners' houses for a Holy Hour, to which friends, family, fellow parishioners and nearby Catholics may be invited. To host this, it is simply necessary to invite participants (or ask to take part), provide a suitable space in a sitting room (flat surface covered by a white cloth with two candles alight), arrange chairs, and be generally welcoming. The Blessed sacrament is brought by Fr Stephen at the arranged time, and as soon as It is placed and exposed, the Holy Hour begins with times of silence, spoken prayer and scripture. It concludes with simple Benediction and then the Blessed Sacrament is taken away from the house. The key is simplicity—this is a devotion taking place at home. A cup of tea over a social time afterwards is a lovely opportunity for Fr Stephen and parishioners to meet one another. This will happen on Thursday afternoons of the first full week of Lent and end the Thursday before Palm Sunday. Please think about being prepared to host a Holy Hour by opening your home up to Christ and to His people.
