He asks us to reflect on the vision for the archdiocese as we cope with a reduction in the resources available to us, including the falling number of priests. What seems to work well? What seems to be a source of blessing? What could be changed to make the very best of what we have? The priests have been asked to reflect on this and you, the lay faithful, very much have a role too. <u>SPAN:</u> This week we sent another £500 towards the CAFOD Food Crisis Appeal and £100 to Darfur- Sudan, resources to help 25 amputees across Africa access unwanted prosthetics from the UK and responding to local family needs for a Ukrainian family and one fleeing domestic abuse. SPAN Lenten Appeal gold envelopes are available. These donations go towards local families in our Primary schools, Zoe's Place Baby Hospice in Coventry and Kiirua Mission Hospital in Kenya.

<u>Pastimes Community Hub:</u> For many years Pastimes in the Hall on Tuesdays has provided a warm welcome to anyone seeking company and conversation, hot drinks and snacks, and a variety of games and activities. In these challenging cost of living times we are developing into a warm hub, offering soup and rolls in addition to our usual refreshments and activities (Tuesdays 11am-3pm). Do come. Spread the word. You will be warmly welcomed!

Holy Week: After consultation, this year Maundy Thursday will be celebrated at Our Lady's, Good Friday and the Easter Vigil at St Peter's. Please regard these as *joint* events for all parishioners of Our Lady's and St Peter's. Fr Stephen cannot be in two places at once. Both parishes have the skills and resources to celebrate Holy Week: let us bring them together in celebration of the passion, death and resourcetion of Christ.

<u>Heating Latest News:</u> Our Lady's The issue is beyond a standard engineer and he has recommend that we have an engineer from the manufacturer. As a newcomer to their services Our Lady's will be charged £1,000 for a day's work plus any parts. This is being booked. Do we really have any choice? **St Peter's** A heating a diocesan recommended consultant is coming for a day next week to assess the needs and possible solutions for heating St Peter's. He will create a plan of action

and a proposal, and be responsible for managing the work. This will cost St Peter's £2,000. As soon as we know what he suggests and the cost this will be shared.

<u>The Parishes' Finances</u> To be clear, each parish maintains it own accounts—income stays with the church it's given to, expenses are paid by the parish that owes them. The joint Finance Committee will be meeting to look at the accounts and then they become available to all parishioners. There are expensive necessary projects looming in both parishes. Our Lady's needs attention to stop leaks and replace rotting woodwork at roof level. St Peter's needs a new heating system and then redecorating.

A great deal of expense has been cut back, which, although good, doesn't actually generate income. The suspension of outside bookings in St Peter's Hall will reduce outgoings further and later in the year we can look at letting in a different way that doesn't lose the parish money. We need a radical re-think if we are to turn its current £14,000 annual deficit into a profit once again.
