Heating News: Our Lady's The boiler manufacturer's engineer has returned the boiler to life! Our timing system is a little old-fashioned but needs resetting. Timers are vital to save wasting what is now very expensive gas indeed. St Peter's The heating expert came for a good look round last week and has now gone off to draw up details of our various options. He feels that replacement electric boilers, using the existing ducting in church will be a possibility. WE await details and costings. In both churches we have saved thousands of pounds by not using gas, the price of which has tripled since last winter. **The Parishes' Finances** The Finance Committee for both parishes is meeting next week and will consider the parishes' accounts and then make them available to parishioners. Both parishes are slowly using up reserves, and both face considerable expense on buildings over the next few years. It will doubtless be helpful to establish small groups of parishioners to consider and facilitate fund raising, work on the buildings and a hall committee for St Peter's. Please think about volunteering. There will be more about this after Easter when volunteers will be called for: you have time to ponder.
