Welcome to Mass, on this Easter Day. Christ is risen, alleluia! Fr Christopher and I wish you all a very happy Easter. Thank you for your Easter greetings, kind words and gifts. At the centre of the Christian faith is the Risen Christ. God reveals His power in the suffering and death of Jesus by raising Him from the dead. Nothing can contain Jesus Christ, not even the tomb. Nothing can therefore separate us from His love, not even death. It is hard for us to imagine the experience of the disciples who went through that first Holy Week and Easter. After all, we know the full story whereas for them—apart from those very few who heard and understood Jesus correctly—the resurrection was an unknown and unexpected event.

But Christ is risen and His Body still bears the marks of His suffering. Those marks of love, the hands, feet and pierced side, are still there in testimony that it is in knowing suffering and death that these are transformed into the new life of the resurrection. Without death, there can be no resurrection. Without Christ's death, there can be no hope. And today we celebrate that hope, revealed in Christ risen from the dead. Alleluia!

<u>This Week:</u> We may rest in the peace of the risen Christ and enjoy some relaxation over the Bank Holiday. From Easter Monday the Masses return to church. It may be a little less warm than the heated hall but Spring is here and it will only get warmer.

<u>SPAN:</u> The SPAN and Kindaid Lenten Appeal finishes the week. Please place envelopes in any collection or a SPAN box. Our SPAN meeting for April will be held on Monday 17th.

Energy Bills: The cost of gas and electricity is now so high that it is vital to turn off unused lights and heating. Had our boilers been working throughout the winter we would have spent about £200 per Sunday Mass! That's a lot of the weekly collection, and most of it at Our Lady's.

<u>Heating News:</u> Our Lady's The repaired boiler does work. Please do **NOT** adjust any controls, so if you have been involved with the boiler, simply turn it on at the wall switches. And then turn it off—gas prices have trebled since last winter.

St Peter's The heating firm that we had to assess our needs reckons that we should either have two new gas boilers and heat as before (a system we know warms the building) or go for electric radiant heaters—a system we have not used and will have an impact on the interior of the church, which will need diocesan approval. We are awaiting approximate costings.

Both parishes will have financial challenges to meet in caring for their buildings and in keeping up regular income. A great deal of cost cutting has been done, but routine maintenance must continue or we store up growing problems for the future. But cost cutting can go only so far. It is now time that we began to think about income. It would seem sensible to establish a fund raising team: details soon.

ay the jubilant voice of the Church reach all of you with the words which the ancient hymn puts on the lips of Mary Magdalene, the first to encounter the risen Jesus on Easter morning. She ran to the other disciples and breathlessly announced: "I have seen the Lord!" (Jn 20:18). We too, who have journeyed through the desert of Lent and the sorrowful days of the Passion, today raise the cry of victory: "He has risen! He has truly risen!"

Every Christian relives the experience of Mary Magdalene. It involves an encounter which changes our lives: the encounter with a unique Man who lets us experience all God's goodness and truth, who frees us from evil not in a superficial and fleeting way, but sets us free radically, heals us completely and restores our dignity. This is why Mary Magdalene calls Jesus "my hope": he was the one who allowed her to

be reborn, who gave her a new future, a life of goodness and freedom from evil. "Christ my hope" means that all my yearnings for goodness find in him a real possibility of fulfilment: with him I can hope for a life that is good, full and eternal, for God himself has drawn near to us, even sharing our humanity.
