Welcome to Mass, - Christ is risen, alleluia!

This Sunday, the octave Day of Easter, has several names: Low Sunday, for the obvious reason of the liturgy being more usual this week after the proclamation of Christ's resurrection last week: the Second Sunday of Easter in recognition of the season of Easter, a feast deserving seven weeks of celebration: and Divine Mercy Sunday, in recognition of God's merciful nature, revealed in today's gospel by the gift of the Holy Spirit among us for the forgiveness of sins. God's love and mercy in Jesus do not come cheap. Christ's glorified, risen Body carries the Sacred wounds in feet, hands and side as a reminder that suffering and death (the 'lows' of life) cannot be avoided but are in fact the way to salvation and eternal life (the 'highs' of life). Thomas won't believe without sight of those wounds, yet when he does, his belief it is total: 'My Lord and my God!'. But Jesus then speaks about you and me, and to you and me: 'Happy are those who have not seen and yet believe!'. May the risen Christ bless you and your loved ones this Easter season. Fr Stephen

# **Divine Mercy**

It is the very nature of God to be merciful and to call us to be merciful too. Think of Holy Scripture—'I desire not the death of a sinner, but that he might turn from his wickedness and live': 'Forgive us our trespasses as forgive those who trespass against us': "'Lord have mercy on me, a sinner" It was this man who went home at right with God': 'Father forgive them, they know not what they are doing'. And He wants a sacramental ministry of mercy in His Church 'Receive the Holy Spirit. For those whose sins you forgive, they are forgiven'. Over the centuries, devotion to God's mercy has been strong—in mediaeval



times devotion to the wounds of Jesus was common. This evolved into the revelations of Jesus's Divine Heart, pierced for our salvation. In the 1930s St Faustina was granted visions of the Divine Mercy in her convent in Krakow. These teachings were popularised by that great Pole Pope St John Paul II, who promoted the use of the image, novena and chaplet of Divine Mercy. 'Jesus, I trust in You!'.
