parish online. Thank you. Church Heating: Some encouraging news for both buildings.

At St Peter's: an engineering firm has made a site visit and will shortly be submitting our first detailed estimate. The new boilers will be able to use the existing ducts in the church and so interior change will be almost unnoticeable. A rough costing is £90,000 (though don't forget that we were considering spending £28,000 just on a repair job). We shall need to be thinking about and doing some fundraising. At Our Lady's it is now the antiquated timer that is preventing reliable use of the heating. This timer is being replaced with something much more modern and easy to use. We need not to waste heating by not being able to set the timing accurately.
