Welcome to Mass Today for Corpus Christi, the celebration of Christ among us Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity, in the form of bread. Whether you are a regular parishioner here, a visitor, student or simply here to see what we believe and do. To you all *welcome!* Our celebration of the Blessed Sacrament is a moment to take stock, and do away with any habitual familiarity we can so easily develop. Do we always remember Who it is who waits for us in our tabernacles? Who comes to us on our altars? Who offers Himself *to us* as Food only because He has offered Himself *for us* as the Lamb of God? Let our actions and words in church, while we are in Christ's Sacramental presence, reflect the reality of that presence. ARRANGING A BAPTISM

Congratulations on the birth of your baby! First of all, parents must begin the process by seeing Fr Stephen *in person* after a Sunday Mass. He can then check a few simple facts and give out a baptism application form. We do not deal with initial arrangements by phone, email or through other members of the family. Parents are required to attend a preparation session before the baptism can take place.

ARRANGING A WEDDING

Congratulations on your engagement! To arrange a wedding, an initial meeting with Fr Stephen is necessary so that the canonical and civil processes can be explained and correctly followed. Couples need to give at least six months' notice.

JUNE, MONTH OF THE SACRED HEART

The heart of God burns with compassion! On today's solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus the Church presents us this mystery for our contemplation: the mystery of the heart of a God who feels compassion and who bestows all his love upon humanity. A mysterious love, which in the texts of the New Testament is revealed to us as God's boundless and passionate love for mankind. God does not lose heart in the face of ingratitude or rejection by the people he has chosen; rather, with infinite mercy he sends his only-begotten Son into the world to take upon himself the fate of a shattered love, so that by defeating the power of evil and death he could restore to human beings enslaved by sin their dignity as sons and daughters.
