Welcome to Mass as we gather to celebrate the resurrection of Jesus to look after this. Could that be vou? Christ

The parable of the Sower presented to us today is one of Jesus' most well known. He talks about the fact that, like a seed, the Word of God is sown in people's hearts. The sowing is the straightforward part: it is what happens next that is more complex. The response of people to the good news of the gospel is—as we know from our experience very varied. We will all know people whose faith is deep and serious, those who once practiced and do so no longer, and those for whom the Gospel is simply irrelevant. Like all Christ's parables, there are many lessons to be taken from this one. One is that the sowing is most important: there can be no growth without it. But that growth needs to be nurtured and encouraged, but ultimately each person 's different response is their responsibility. While we cannot remove every distraction and problem from people's lives, we can offer the Word of God and encourage its growth. But we must not neglect to tend the seed that has been sown in our own hearts too.

Later this year, a fundamental part of the newly announced forthcoming Deanery Visitation, will be a seeking to find the best way to serve Christ and His Church using our current resources. Please see the note about this on the sheet. There will be opportunities for us all to engage with the Diocesan Vision in conversation with the Archbishop or Episcopal Vicar, one of whom will be visiting all the parishes of the Deanery.
