In today's readings when Ezekiel hears his task as a prophet compared to that of a sentry, God is making a vital but simple point. Not to a give a warning of impending disaster is wrong: to do nothing is not an option, we must do what is right. In the Gospel, Jesus warns against the great temptation to dwell on wrongs done to us by going off to discuss them with others. Yes, we might need advice, but it is too easy to seek comfort or even justification for our anger. No, go and talk to the one who has wronged us. That conversation must be positive and open, not a set of demands that the other must grovel and eat humble pie. It is forgiveness and reconciliation are at the heart of the Gospel, and not vengeance and vindica-

Congratulations on your engagement! To arrange a wedding, an initial meeting with Fr Stephen is necessary so that the canonical and civil processes can be explained and correctly followed. Couples need to give at least six months' notice.

ARRANGING A BAPTISM

Congratulations on the birth of your baby! First, parents must begin the process by seeing Fr Stephen in person at a Sunday Mass. He can then check a few simple facts and give out a baptism application form. We do not deal with initial arrangements by phone, email or through other members of the family, but face to face. Parents need to attend a preparation session before the baptism can take place.
