Today is designated by Pope Francis Evangelii Gaudiium Sunday, a day to pray for the mission and missions of the Church. The phrase means 'joy of the Gospel'. The Christmas Angels heralded Christ's birth by saying 'We bring you news of great joy..!'. An important part of bearing witness is that Gospel means that we have reason to be joyful! Today's Gospel is a consideration of God's mercy. The good news is that we may be forgiven ourselves, and that being forgiven we must share that joy with others—unlike the wicked servant who benefitting from the master's mercy refuses to share the joy of forgiveness with his fellow servant. The gospel is something attractive and joyful: we let that be present in our own Christian living. Thank you to everyone who came along to the induction on Wednes-

day—servers, singers, musicians, flower arrangers and all manner of helpers. The event was later after my arrival than usual, and so I know just how welcoming parishioners have been for a whole year and not just one evening. Thank you. God bless, Fr Stephen

Deanery Visitation & The Diocesan Vision St Peter's has been asked to host the opening Mass for the visitation. The date is still to be confirmed. Bicester parish will host closing Vespers. Our Lady's and St Peter's Visitation will be on 27 & 28 Jan 2024. Canon Paul Fitzpatrick, the Episcopal Vicar will be carrying this out. There will be a timetable of events and opportunities for us to engage with him. As well as meeting parishioners and clergy, Canon Paul will be considering our finances, schools, the condition of our buildings, the worship, social care and outreach of the parishes.

The backdrop at present is our changing level of resources. Leamington now has half the number of priests it did ten years ago. This year, no one was ordained to the priesthood for the diocese and next year there will—God willing—be one. There are seven men in formation. By 2033, 43pc of currently active priests will have reached or exceeded retirement age—75. How are we encouraging young men in our parishes and families to consider ordination? How do we grow our congregations? Change cannot be avoided, but we can shape it! Therefore, there will be a meeting at Bicester on the evening of Fri 13 Oct, for all parishes, clergy and parish representatives. Details soon

ARRANGING A BAPTISM

Congratulations on the birth of your baby! First, parents must begin the process by seeing Fr Stephen in person at a Sunday Mass. He can then check a few simple facts and give out a baptism application form. We do not deal with initial arrangements by phone, email or through other members of the family, but face to face. Parents need to attend a preparation session before the baptism can take place.
