THE DIOCESAN VISION & THE VISITATION

St Peter's has been asked to host the opening Mass for the visitation. The date is still to be confirmed. Bicester parish will host closing Vespers. Our Lady's and St Peter's Visitation will be on 27 & 28 Jan 2024. Canon Paul Fitzpatrick, the Episcopal Vicar will be carrying this out. There will be a timetable of events and opportunities for us to engage with him. As well as meeting parishioners and clergy, Canon Paul will be considering our finances, schools, the condition of our buildings, the worship, social care and outreach of the parishes. The backdrop at present is our changing level of resources. Leamington now has half the number of priests it did ten years ago. This year, no one was ordained to the priesthood for the diocese and next year there will—God willing—be one. There are seven men in formation. By 2033, 43pc of currently active priests will have reached or exceeded retirement age - 75. How are we encouraging young men in our parishes and families to consider ordination? How do we grow our congregations?

Change cannot be avoided, but we can shape it! Therefore, there will be a **meeting at Bicester on the evening of Fri 13 Oct,** for all parishes, clergy and parish representatives. Various members of the parishes—especially those connected with finance, catechists, schools for example—are asked to attend.

This is an introductory meeting to begin exploring the process of planning. It arises out of the experience of Kenilworth parish who have begun to discuss this issue among themselves. Things are of course at this stage a little vague. The diocese wants to consult at parish level and, ideally, for decisions to be made by parishes in their deaneries. This is the notion of 'subsidiarity': no one is going to tell us what needs to reorganised, clustered, amalgamated, sold, rebuilt or closed, but a mixture of these things have to happen. If we don't plan then bit by bit parishes will face problems they cannot solve. There is no magic money tree at the Archdiocese!

Next week, the delayed presentation of accounts will take place for the two parishes. The figures in themselves are a snapshot of how 2022 went. There is always a history behind why accounts are as they are. The picture for St Peter' and for Our Lady's are mixed. St Peter's faces a big bill for the boilers.

Our Lady's is at the beginning of the process of curing the roof leaks and replacing rotten high level woodwork. Both these projects will take up almost all the available funds, if not more. St Peter's hall continues to lose money as its use has not returned to anything like prepandemic levels but the cost of water, gas and electricity have trebled. Our Hall Group is working hard to promote its use and they deserve our thanks. We shall be reviewing progress in six months'

time. Please suggest the hall to anyone you know who wants to hire a venue like it. But the bottom line is that we simply cannot lose money on the building indefinitely. Parishes are reaching the point where they need to show that they are ,or are becoming, viable in every sense—people, finances, buildings.

SUPPORTING THE PARISHES

First, we need to be faithful in our attendance. Do you know people who have fallen away from attending our churches and could be welcomed back? Are there friends of yours who fell out over someone or something and need to be encouraged back with joy and celebration? We are approaching the point where staying away from your church starts becoming almost a vote to close it. That sounds harsh, but how can a parish be viable if people stop away from it? If parishes have to be amalgamated, clustered or closed it will be the small ones that people don't go to that will face extra issues.

Second, we need to give practical and financial support to our parishes. Volunteering is something we rely on, but is sometimes in short supply. Readers at Mass, servers, stewards, cleaners, children's liturgy helpers, social events and so on show a lively and committed parish. But we also need to pay the bills, so thank you for your giving! Are you giving in an efficient way? As a tax payer, if you make a Gift Aid declaration the taxman adds 25% for your giving at no cost to you! The parish reclaims the tax you paid and every £100 donated turns into £125. Very efficient! Are you able to leave the parish a legacy? We would be grateful if you are. Do you have a smart phone? You can donate via the QR code on the next page. Are you giving what you did ten years ago and could you perhaps add a little to make up for inflation? Is what you give the price of a newspaper, or a pint of beer or a meal out? These are questions that will not be asked of you directly—don't worry! - but are offered merely to get us all thinking.

Our two wonderful church buildings and lovely parishes are testament to the hard work and devotion of previous priests and people, as well as all of you who are in them today. We are stewards of what they begun so that it may be handed on to the people and priests of the future, that the faith is proclaimed and God's love and mercy experienced afresh.

May God bless all that we in His name and the Holy Spirit guide all our thoughts and actions. We can't go wrong if He does!
