He has not respected the importance of the occasion and casually comes along. In reality this seems like two parables. The first is that God's generosity will be taken up but not always by those one might expect—yet the penalty for ignoring it is great. And the second: But having received the invitation we must not be complacent but

always faithful, hopeful and loving. Our wedding garment is not a change of clothes, but a change of heart. God bless, *Fr Stephen*

ARRANGING A WEDDING

Congratulations on your engagement! To arrange a wedding, an initial meeting with Fr Stephen is necessary so that the canonical and civil processes can be explained and correctly followed. Couples need to give at least six months' notice.

ARRANGING A BAPTISM

Congratulations on the birth of your baby! First, parents must begin the process by seeing Fr Stephen *in person* at a Sunday Mass. He can then check a few simple facts and give out a baptism application form. We do not deal with initial arrangements by phone, email or through other members of the family, but face to face. Parents need to attend a preparation session before the baptism can take place.
