The issue of Roman taxes taken from the Jews was an explosive one in Jesus' day, and feature in the Gospel for this Sunday. Hated by the Jews as a sign of their conquest but also as supporting a pagan empire, these taxes were nonetheless rigidly enforced by the Roman authorities. The question put to Jesus is therefore a difficult one, and it is meant to trap Him. If He says "Pay your taxes to Caesar" then He could be seen as a traitor to the Jewish cause. If He says "Don't pay your taxes to Caesar", then the Romans can arrest Him as a political agitator inciting revolt against the Roman authorities. But Jesus will not fall into any such trap. If only the Pharisees would listen. Not only does He escape their trap, but He teaches too. What Caesar wants are things materialistic, powerful and worldly. What God wants are things utterly different: hearts and minds. These are much more valuable. As elected governments and even dictators come and go, and as the world's economy goes up and down, Jesus speaks about what can never fail and what can always be relied on: God.
