NOVEMBER, MONTH OF THE HOLY SOULS

ETERNAL REST GRANT UNTO THEM O LORD

'We must empty purgatory with our prayers'. St Padre Pio

<u>WELCOME TO MASS</u> We gather as the Church to offer together the Sacrifice Jesus commanded His followers to do in memory of His death and resurrection.

The early Christians believed that Christ's return to earth would be very soon: two thousand years later we are still waiting. This is not a reason for doubt or disappointment: Christ's first coming was eagerly awaited by many who never saw it, as the Old Testament bears witness. Some early Christians began to fear for those who died before Christ's return, but St Paul points out that all shall meet Him, for our earthly death is not the end of life, but a change in life. Jesus tells the story of the five wise and foolish bridesmaids. None of them doubted the groom's arrival, but not all of them were ready when it happened. Some of them just expected everything to be all right but did nothing to make sure it was! All Christians need to be ready for Jesus by prayer, and acts of love and mercy. Then He will recognise us as friends when He comes again. This is Advent's theme, as we shall soon experience once again.

There is a lot on the notice sheet this week: please do read it. Take it away with you to read over coffee. We try to make it as informative as possible so that you have the information you need. Please do share copies with anyone interested or perhaps needing an invitation to return to Mass.

HOLY COMMUNION: If you are not a Roman Catholic, a member of a church in full communion with it, or an Orthodox unable to attend an Orthodox Liturgy, you are warmly invited to come forward for a blessing at the time of Holy Communion. Holy Communion cannot be given to all, as it is for us the sign of *unity in the faith*. Communion is not bread and wine, but the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of God the Son. Let us pray for true unity among all Christians, as God wills. As for Catholics, we need always to remember the truth of the Blessed Sacrament and receive Jesus with care, attention and revenence. Blessed be Jesus in the most Holy Sacrament of the Altar!

REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY: We pray for all those who have lost their lives in war, remembering also those wounded physically or mentally, and all who mourn them. Let us pray for peace in the world, for wisdom for the nations' leaders and for reconciliation between countries and peoples.

NOVEMBER—MONTH OF THE HOLY SOULS: We pray throughout November for those who have died. Envelopes for particular names are available as usual. There is a basket in the sanctuary to receive them.

In November it is the custom to focus our prayers a little more on the departed. This is because this month contains two great days, our celebration of All Saints and our commemoration of All Souls, as well as Remembrance Sunday, which remind us that the Church consists not only of us here on earth, but that the Saints and the departed are part of it too.

The month of November is dedicated to the Holy Souls in Purgatory. The practice of praying for the dead is rooted in scripture and remains a staple in Catholic spirituality (not just in November, but every day.) According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church -

"All who die in God's grace and friendship but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death, they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven." (CCC 1030)

Purgatory is not a second chance for souls to repent. Instead, it is a state of purification for those destined to be in Heaven.

St John Vianney said, "Consider then...the magnitude of these sufferings which the souls in Purgatory endure; and the means which we have of mitigating them: our prayers, our good works, and, above all, the holy sacrifice of the Mass".

The blessing of graves is a way of praying for the departed. Originally, this custom meant going from Mass out to the churchyard for a short prayer service. Now that many churches have no graveyards, such ceremonies often take place further afield. If you have a loved one buried in the local cemetery, please come along on 19 Nov at 2.30pm. A short prayer service is followed by prayers of blessing at each grave, as requested by those who are present. We can all pray for the Holy Souls: why not offer a decade of the rosary for them daily this month? We may assume that there is much joy in Purgatory as the prayers for the Holy Souls intensify each November. Those who have died are still part of the Church and with lives changed, not ended, they continue on their Christian journey. Let us help them! REMEMBERING TO PRAY: A statue of Our Lady of Fatima is in St Peter's Church this weekend as part of a nationwide tour to support Rosary prayers for the nation, for the Church, in reparation for sins, and to be a quiet, reverent witness to the faith. The tour of the statue is part of the Public Rosary lay initiative organised through UK Prays.org and we will have it with us for our public rosary in front of the Pump Rooms this Sunday at 4.30 pm and Sun 26 Nov. We meet every two weeks in the car park in St Peter's at 4.15 pm and walk into town (usually in front of the Pump Rooms) where we say the Rosary and some prayers for 30 minutes. Do take part if you can.
