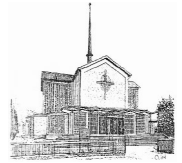

Dear Parishioners,

I enjoyed a good week away from my responsibilities with a mixed bag of weather but feel rejuvenated after a sunny day at the seaside. One day I visited a craft centre and an alternative energy centre. I had some lovely drives through the mountainous scenery and a good rest. It was also an opportunity to reflect on the loss of my dog, Bertie, a faithful companion for ten years. Returning home, I find I am looking and listening for him. When you have a dog you are always wondering where they are. Thank you to all who sent cards of sympathy. Your kind words were much appreciated.

My first "official" day back was as busy as usual with a Zoom Deanery Meeting, lots of emails, telephone call, decisions and arrangements. The Deanery Clergy who were able to attend were in fine form. We discussed the new Hospital Rota.

Thankfully most of us hadn't had too many emergency calls but Fr. Damian of Wootton Wawen with one of the furthest distances to travel found he was asked to return to the hospital for a second time the minute he returned home from the first call.

We also discussed the Deanery Paper. This was an explanation of the Curial Finances and followed a period of consultation concerning the levy payments for each parish throughout the Diocese. One point to remember is how each Church receives support from the Central Offices in different ways. Running an organisation the size and complexity of 250 Churches, various schools, professional advisors, charity law, the care of retired or sick Clergy costs a lot of money. Each parish helps to support the running of the Diocese. What does this mean for St. Peter's, Our Lady's and St. Joseph's Churches?

St. Peter's – income - £112,000. Diocesan levy - £20,000
St. Joseph's – income - £79,000. Diocesan levy - £18,000
Our Lady's – income - £25,500. Diocesan levy - £6,635
Effectively this means St. Peter's and Our Lady's will contribute £26,000 and adding St. Joseph's a total for our 3 churches of £44,000. Each church has its own separate parish and financial entity.

Being part of a family is expensive. When I think of the cost of bringing up children with all their needs for clothes, shoes, food and all the hidden expenses of running a household I know the responsibility of parenthood are great but this is not in the end how families are measured. Parents do not tell their children how much they cost but care for their needs. We must do the same for our parish family, we must cut our coat according to our cloth. Similarly the Diocese is looking to make some big cuts and savings to its expenditure. In the same way we too can think about the small ways in which we can make savings especially after the tough year of 2020.
