#### Dear Parishioners,

This weekend we celebrate the Feast of All Saints on the day which heralds a month of prayer and special remembrance for the Holy Souls. It is good to begin the month on the positive note of thanksgiving for the lives of those who are recognised by the Church as an example of faith and holiness to us all. Our Christian journey is inspired by their experience of living the faith to the best of their ability. In our own lives we aspire to do the same and ask their prayers to help us.

The month of prayer for the Holy Souls begins on All Souls day on Monday. Throughout Catholic Leamington you have a whole range of Masses from early morning until evening so I do hope you will be able to find one which suits your timetable. The Church reminds us that on this day we can receive a Plenary Indulgence if you attend Mass on 2<sup>nd</sup> November and pray one Our Father and the Creed.

This year our plans to celebrate the Blessing of the Graves on Sunday afternoon cannot take place officially. If you would like to bring a small bottle of clean water to mass the Clergy will Bless it for you and as individuals you can go to the cemetery to Bless and pray for the Souls of your loved ones. All the priests regularly attend the Cemetery and our Burial Service includes prayers for all the Holy Souls. Please be advised that groups of no more than 6 people can congregate around a grave. Please follow the general guidelines. Wear a mask and do not hasten your own mortal journey by taking unnecessary risks.

The evening Mass at St Peter's on a Tuesday will be moved to 11 am from 10<sup>th</sup> November. The time of this evening mass was for the lighter evenings but I think at this time of year more parishioners might like to attend a mass at 11 am in the morning before doing a bit of shopping, going for a walk in the park or visiting the library.

Another reason for the Tuesday Mass is because we seem to be having a run of Requiem Masses on Thursday at 11 am. As you know these occasions last an hour and are restricted to the immediate family and friends and only 30 people can attend. We really shouldn't allow any parishioners to attend a Requiem Mass unless they have been invited by the family of the deceased.

I have ordered 10 copies of the new Encyclical from Pope Francis called "Fratelli Tutti". If anyone would like a copy to read at home, please let me know. It is a document which follows on from Laudato Si. The new encyclical reminds us that as part of God's family we are brothers and sisters and share in the responsibility of caring for each other as much as we also care for our common home. It is an easy read.

I am hoping to re-open the Piety shop. There is room in the shop for the salesperson and the buyer. We have boxes of Christmas cards and individual cards, sympathy cards, statues, candles, pictures and books, rosaries, crucifixes etc. If you would like to help as a volunteer in the shop, please contact Royce in the Parish Office or leave a message on the answerphone.
