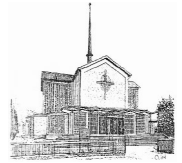

Seven-day candles:

The Main Altar candle burns for **Patrick Joseph Kelly RIP**

Dear Parishioners,

Do you remember Ash Wednesday last year? I do. The church was full of people and we all received the ashes. Some of us twice! Last year the priests were advised to mix the ashes with olive oil. This meant the mark of the cross was particularly strong and dark. I remember thinking I would have liked to take a photograph of you because we all had this dark smudge of ashes on our foreheads. As we listened to the readings, I had my usual sense of frustration as I heard the reader say "Now now. It is the Lord who speaks!" Every year the comma between now and now is missed which means the sense of occasion, the seriousness of the message is completely lost. However, in the weeks and months which followed the sense of occasion with the beginning of a much longer time of penance was and is something we have completely understood in ways which none of us could ever have thought possible. During those 40 days last year what began with our almsgiving, prayer and fasting became a challenge of life. At first, we thought it would last for just a few weeks but as the hospitals began to fill up with patients of all ages and number of deaths increased, the reality of the Coronavirus hit. We were not ready for what happened, its easy to be critical of the people who were trying to help but the truth is that none of us knew what to expect and none of us were ready, but we all realised very quickly that lockdown was the only weapon we had in the fight against this dreadful disease.

This year we begin Ash Wednesday once again after a year in which our freedom has been necessarily curtailed to protect the lives of the vulnerable. This is reflected in every aspect of our lives and in our faith. Many of us will need to spend Ash Wednesday at home but even so we can mark this day in the way the Gospel tells us to. Put olive oil (not motor oil) (and don't pour it from the bottle) on your head and then wash it off "and your Heavenly Father who sees all that is done in secret will reward you". Follow the Mass with us on Live Stream, Zoom, or by telephone if you follow the Middlesbrough Mass. If at home watch, listen and have a few drops of some olive oil nearby. At the time when the priest is distributing the ashes put that cross of oil on your forehead, turn to the Gospel and pray for forgiveness.

This year we shall sprinkle the ashes on the heads of those who are able to attend Mass. Please don't all come to the 10.30 am Mass at St Peter's because we can only accommodate 100 people. If you can, could you come to the 7pm Mass at St. Peter's or the 12 noon mass at Our Lady's this will help to share the numbers out. I note there is only one Mass on Ash Wednesday at St Joseph's so please bear this in mind. We will do our best to accommodate parishioners but if you arrive late be warned that you may need to follow the mass outside on live stream. If we have any ash left I am sure the priests can distribute the ashes after Ash Wednesday (after mass).
