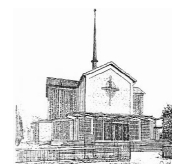

This weekend we celebrate the Feast of Christ the King. It is also a Day of Prayer for the Young People of the Parish. There are some special prayers for you to look at on the website. It is an apposite moment to thank Emma Rayment on behalf of the parish and her many helpers who help to run of the Unite Youth Group for the School aged young people of Catholic Leamington. Take a look at "Youth" on the parish website and be amazed by the activities on offer. They have led many virtual meetings via zoom and social media over the time of lockdown intermingled with some real time events. I would like to congratulate Unite for providing many interesting and enjoyable events for our young people. If you have a youngster aged 11 + who is not a member of Unite please have a chat with Emma and find out what it offers.

A new Young Adults Group was set up this year to provide a focus for the 18-30 year olds. Many thanks to Rose Pauling and Niall Herbert for this initiative. There are a number of Diocesan and other initiatives which are good to tap into.

At the end of the FHC programme for 2020 we say farewell to Mary Grayling who, with Jenny Hayden, has run the parish catechism First Holy Communion Programme for ten years and for the first eight of them the Confirmation programme as well. I am grateful for the time she has given us and her commitment to instruct the young people of the parish on Saturday afternoons. I am sure Mary will find having Saturdays free a novel experience.

The Feast of Christ the King is the icing on the cake of the year which for at least half of it is unprecedented in our history but we did manage to have the Deanery Episcopal Visitation in February as well as the Sacrament of Confirmation for the Primary Schools of St Peter's and Our Lady's. We have managed a few Baptisms and one First Holy Communion Mass. Fr Noel celebrated a Confirmation Mass at St Joseph's a few weeks ago. Our strange year has seen the parish societies and groups adapting to the circumstances of lockdown, embracing new technology and acclimatising themselves to Virtual meetings of Zoom or Team, Facebook or Live stream. We have discovered a new vocabulary of words. For example who among us had ever heard of being furloughed, speaking about the 'R' number or the 'exponential' rise in cases? To use another term from the study of mathematics, it has been a real learning curve! Having said this I think we need to be aware that many non technophobes have felt increasingly isolated because they do not have access to a computer, or the knowledge and ability to set one up. The Facebook Portal and similar technologies is a good way of having face to face calls and for live streaming mass. It is not cheap. The newsletter is a good way for people to stay in touch. Sometimes it is not easy to get it to print when our website goes on strike so if this happens could I suggest you go onto Warwick RC Deanery website and print from there. If you could post a copy to anyone elderly or housebound who lives nearby I am sure they would appreciate your kindness.

This weekend I welcome all who are able to participate in our live stream masses, open church for prayer, evening devotions on Sunday and during the week as we give thanks to God for the Year which began last Advent. *Continued on page 3*

First Holy Communion Programme 2021 for children who attend non Catholic Schools: Parents of children who are now in Year 3 or above who attend non Catholic Schools please contact the parish office stperaposle.leamington@rcaob.org.uk marked First Holy Communion 2021 to register your child for this programme.

The Course will be run via Zoom. It will begin at 2.30 pm on Saturday afternoon and each session will last for approximately half an hour. It is 20 sessions in total, excluding all school holidays. Parents will receive a package via email each week before the session with everything they will need ie prayers, home task, etc.

The Enrolment Mass for new candidates will be on Saturday 9th January. Reconciliation Service and First Confession on 6th March. First Holy Communion Mass on Saturday 19th June.

Visiting the sick and the dying is at the very heart of the priestly vocation. Seven priests from the Deanery are on 24-hour availability one day a week to respond to hospital emergency calls. Two of these will deal with the Covid calls.

The clergy are beginning to think about Penitential services, Advent retreats and Recollection, decorations, Christmas trees, where to put the crib, Christmas Masses, what they will look like and how to safely accommodate our Parishioners.
