Priestly Disguise in Elizabethan and Jacobean England



During the reign of Elizabeth I and the following post-Reformation years, disguise was essential for gaining access to Roman Catholic sacraments. This talk is hosted at Harvington Hall on Wednesday 26 July from 3:00 pm till 4:30 pm as part of a History Week

Dr Sarah Johanesen discusses how the materials and language of clothing, accessories, and personal appearance were used against Catholics, to emphasise the threat they posed. Both in conflict with Protestants and other Catholics, appearance could become a political weapon. She is a Lecturer in Early Modern History at the University of Manchester and completed her PhD at King's College London in 2020, on the politics of Catholic-owned objects and materials in post-Reformation England. Sarah's talk draws on her article, *'That Silken Priest': Catholic disguise and anti-papery on the English Mission (1569–1640)*, which won the Sir John Neale Prize in Early Modern History (2019)

Talks are between 45 to 60 minutes, followed by a Q&A and book signing where available. Please note finish times are approximate. When booking your tickets, you can pre-order Tea/Coffee with cake or scone and jam with clotted cream for £6.00. Full information go to www.harvingtonhall.co.uk

Roadshow for Catholic charity supporting prisoners

PACT is the national Catholic charity supporting prisoners and their families. We provide family services in eleven prisons across the Archdiocese of Birmingham. We also support people affected by imprisonment in local communities. Maybe you can help spread the word about who we are, what we do, and how people can help?

We are holding a roadshow on Saturday 15 July between 10.00 am and 1:30 pm in the Grimshaw Room on the St Chad's Cathedral site. We are thrilled that the event, organised in partnership with Caritas Birmingham, will be opened by Archbishop Bernard Longley

Come and meet staff and volunteers working in the area, and our Faith in Action team, as well as prison chaplains and The Welcome Directory, a multi-faith charity

As Catholic Christians, why do we support prisoners and their families? A woman we helped recently, said, '*PACT is like a little light, it gives you hope.*' Certainly, we are responding to Jesus' words, '*I was in prison, and you came to me*' – but something deeper is happening too

At the roadshow we will reflect on Catholic Social Teaching in the light of imprisonment. We will hear from people with lived experience of the criminal justice system. Prison chaplains and Pact services staff will speak about their work and the people we serve. The Welcome Directory is a small charity which supports faith communities to become places of welcome and acceptance for those leaving prison. Find out about how your parish might become such a place

PACT warmly invites you to join us in person at the Roadshow. The event will speak to ecumenical friends too
