Fr Christopher Greaney RIP

Fr Chris's sudden and unexpected death at home, late on Wednesday 27 December, has come as a great shock to us all. Fr Chris had been active celebrating Mass at St Peter's on 23, 24 and 26 December, and enjoying meals out with friends on each of those days too. We missed his appearance at Mass on 28 December and after phone messages went unanswered and he failed to answer his door on Thursday lunchtime for a lift to a routine hospital appointment, it was discovered what had happened

Fr Chris had had a career in teaching at first, finally becoming deputy head of Arnold Lodge prep school in Leamington. He left that job to pursue his vocation to the priesthood and was sent to the Beda in Rome, the seminary for English-speaking mature vocations. A fellow student was Fr John Cross, the previous parish priest of St Peter's. Fr Chris was ordained to the priesthood in 1993 in St Peter's Church and served first at St Chad's Cathedral during which time he also helped to set up a diocesan newspaper. From there he went on to Handsworth, Norton-le-Moors, Kidlington and Stourport. Fr Chris retired to Leamington, a town he knew well, six years ago and immediately set about supporting the local priests in their ministries as well as renewing old friendships and creating new ones. He had an active ministry based at St Peter's Church and school, although the altar steps at Our Lady's proved too much for him eventually. He readily helped in recent times such as at Whitnash when there was no priest, and in the local parishes to provide cover for ill or holidaying parish priests

He was an active Catenian, a rarity among priests since once ordained no priest may join, but his membership came from his time in teaching and he was delighted to maintain it. He belonged to several prayer groups and was a committed member of the Carmelite group that meets in Coventry. Travelling was an interest too but increasing health and mobility problems made that more difficult. Trips to Medjugorje and Oberammergau last year, although much enjoyed, were made with considerable discomfort and consequent lasting tiredness

I am one of many of us who will have wonderful memories of Fr Chris and will miss him greatly. On a personal note, he was a great support to me beyond simply helping out but also with his wisdom,


knowledge, friendship and encouragement. His sense of humour lightened many a problem! He was a welcome and frequent visitor to the presbytery, and he enjoyed good food, wine and conversation. I am immensely grateful for having known him, and I know that others will feel the same

Study Group for Sunday Readings

As many Catholic Leamington parishioners know, in 2023 the second stage of our 'Walking Together' programme examined four areas identified in stage one as priorities for the Church in general, and in particular for our own parishes, to improve our practice as a truly Christian community:

- building community by getting to know one another better and to recognize our gifts;
- becoming more inclusive and welcoming;
- deepening and sharing our faith; and
- prioritizing young people

In our discernment sessions last May we listed a large number of practical actions we could take to put these objectives into effect, many of which have been implemented since then

In the area of deepening and sharing our faith, two suggested actions were to set up a *Bible study group*, which I am glad to say has already started at St Joseph's, and a *group studying the following Sunday's mass readings*, which I would like to get going early in 2024. For it to work I think we need a core of four or five people who would hope to attend every week, at least for the first four months. Then we can be quite flexible in accommodating others who would like to turn up occasionally, provided they give me (or the group leader in my absence) advance notice of when they are coming. In broad terms, I could hold these meetings on Wednesday afternoons or evenings or any time on Fridays. The meetings could be in St Peter's Parish Hall or possibly at my home depending on how many want to come and the availability of a suitable room

The format I envisage is: a brief introduction by me (or an alternative group leader) of the background or context of the scripture passages; then a reading and short discussion of each in turn of the first reading, second reading and Gospel for the following Sunday, focussing on what the inspired writer was trying to convey to his readers or listeners at the time; finally a short 'Conversation in the Spirit' (as practised in our Walking Together sessions, and at the Synod of Bishops in Rome last October) sharing our ideas on what God is saying to us today in any or all of the passages

This approach has some of the merits of traditional Bible study in learning more about the books of the Bible and their relevance to us today, but also gives us new insights as others share how the Holy Spirit has interacted with their experiences in understanding what the scriptural passages are telling them, and also deepens our engagement with the Liturgy of the Word in the Sunday Mass
