KINDAID

The **Kiirua Mission**, situated in the Rift Valley area of Kenya, offers loving care from a Christian Community for children who have been orphaned or abandoned. With the aim of reintegration into their own families or the wider community wherever possible the children are nurtured and educated and given the tools to overcome past experiences and build self esteem and self confidence. Funding also supports some of the older children to access secondary school and higher education.



The Mission also includes a hospital which, as well as offering primary care, provides the local residents with a range of health education programmes and support initiatives which currently include a nutrition and feeding programme for their younger children.

offers specialist care and support to adult patients and their families in Coventry and Warwickshire, including Leamington Spa. Our patients have terminal conditions such as heart failure, cancer, motor neurone disease, Parkinson's and COPD. All our services are free of charge.

"Due to the impact Coronavirus has had on our ability to raise vital funds we expect to see a significant drop in voluntary income of somewhere in the region of £2 million this year."

"Being based in Leamington Spa, you may be interested to know that in the year to 31st March 2020, Myton at Home provided care to 26 patients from CV31 postcodes and 28 patients from CV32 postcodes. With 441 visits in total, this represented a patient receiving 8 visits on average."

"Each visit costs Myton an average of £106. Some patients will receive up to 3 visits per day, some have care during the night. A grant of £2,000 would pay for 18 visits to residents of Leamington Spa (held in restricted funds for this purpose) by either Registered Nurses or Nursing Assistants to provide end of life care to patients in their homes."

Beginning in the first week of Lent, we will be meeting each Friday to use the *Holy Week Voices* book as our guide...





MESSAGE FROM THE FAIR TRADE FOUNDATION

'CHOOSE THE WORLD YOU WANT THIS FAIRTRADE FORTNIGHT

In Fairtrade Fortnight 2021, we will highlight the growing challenges that climate change brings to farmers and workers in the communities Fairtrade works with. The facts are straightforward. Farmers and workers in countries such as Kenya, Ethiopia and Honduras, who have done the least to contribute to climate change, are disproportionately affected by it. They have told us that:

- **Climate change is one of their biggest challenges right now.**
- **Low prices for their crops mean that they are struggling to fight back.**
- **Only with more money will they feel equipped to meet their everyday needs and deal with the challenges they face from climate change.**

The climate crisis is an immediate and ever-increasing threat and those in climate vulnerable countries are already seeing its impacts from droughts and crop disease to floods, heatwaves and shrinking harvests.

We need your help to put farmer's voices at the heart of tackling the climate crisis and share the reality of their struggles. Our global trading system is balanced in favour of the powerful few. Trapped in this system farmers already struggle to meet their basic needs. More than ever they need a fair price for their crops and their hard work. Fair trade works to raise the voices of the farmers and workers and prioritise what they need to respond to the environmental crises unfolding in already vulnerable communities. This Fortnight we are asking you to 'Choose the World you Want' and use your voice to tell others about the challenges that farmers face from climate change.'

TO DO LIST FOR FAIR TRADE FORTNIGHT AND BEYOND

- Search out Fair Trade items for your shopping – look for the logo – at all supermarkets. There are lots of brands of tea, coffee and chocolate, plus many other items, bananas, sugar, rice, dried fruit, cleaning materials and many others.

- What does your faith mean to you personally?


Answering one of these, or similar questions, will give you an outline to share your faith journey.
