Anne reported that unfortunately the present wrapping to be done by 'Churches Together' in the Royal Priors did not happen as the management of the Royal priors decided not to support it.

Warwick J and P have organised a showing of the film 'the Letter' promoting 'Laudato Si' at St Mary Immaculate – on 2 occasions, the first being Sunday 29th January at 3pm. Jonathan has watched some of this on Youtube.

Prayer intention for January/February

Poverty and Homelessness

The Saturday Friendship Group is still unable to function due to lack of staff and Jenny was told today at the Way Ahead Project that there were plans for a reorganisation which would reduce staff again. This is out for consultation and will take some time. Meanwhile the WAP is very busy during the week and very much appreciated by the visitors there, for the warmth, company, washing facilities and refreshments, plus advice and help.

Anna reported that the LWS Night Shelter is now up and running again and is at Radford Road Church where the Leamington Night Shelter used to be. AC Lloyd have helped to build storage and other facilities at the Centre (article in the Leamington Courier this week)

Street Pastors are still running – there was mention of them and prayers for them at the Churches Together united service on Sunday 22nd at St Paul's Church which was attended some of us and Father Stephen.

Pastimes have arranged with Warwick District Council to become a' Warm Hub' during time they are open on a Tuesday.

Live Simply

A meeting is planned for the next week. Christmas display at SP has now been taken down.

An article went into January Extra about new year resolutions. The Recycling for CAFOD box is still at Our Lady's and another cheque has gone to CAFOD.

Fair Trade

It was reported this week that, sadly, Traidcraft who have been promoting Fair trade since 1979 have just gone into administration. The charity 'Transform Trade' which was known as 'Traidcraft Exchange' sent the information. They continue with their work.

Jenny has had a message from Michael Porter that he still has Traidcraft stock so she can explore still having a stall for Fair Trade for this FT Fortnight. (27th Feb -12th March)

CAFOD and Stations of the Cross

We have been considering how to run some stations of the cross for J and P during Lent. A suggestion is that there are online resources from CAFOD - taking a walk through Stations of the Cross with prayers and information about issues affecting people who are suffering – an emphasis on Sierra Leone. It was felt that they looked suitable and were ready to be used (to explore the issue of a licence to show). We would show it in the hall – probably either before or after the 11 a.m. Mass (which may be moved) This may bring in more people if near the mass time. Jenny will email Father Stephen -- (Father Stephen was in full agreement with this plan) We need to discuss the practicalities and have a meeting for Wednesday 1st Feb at 7 pm by zoom .

ACAT (Action by Christians against Torture)

Diana has looked at the ACAT website which highlights 9 people from different countries and we will try to hold a card signing in the Easter season.
