Jenny hosted this second Zoom meeting. The last meeting was on 29<sup>th</sup> June.

We started with the SPAN prayer and a reflection on the reading for the 18<sup>th</sup> Sunday in ordinary time. Matthew 14 13 -21 (the feeding of the 5,000)

## Matters arising from the last meeting.

Brian, Anne and Jenny had taken part in a Zoom meeting with their MPs (Matt Western and Jeremy Wright) regarding Climate change and the lobby of Parliament by the Climate Coalition. Anne and Jenny felt that Matt Western was very in tune with the aims of the Climate Coalition and is working towards a greener future. There was also a follow on from the meeting - a networking of the people who attended the Zoom meeting who are very involved in local green issues. Matt Western chairs the committee in Parliament on electric vehicles. Brian was not convinced that Jeremy Wright was actively engaged in the cause and although he spoke in favour there wasn't any real commitment. However, Brian had written subsequently to Jeremy Wright and it had been forwarded to the Secretary of State for DEFRA. Jonathan had written to Matt Western also on the subject of Climate Change.

**Contacting parishioners who are isolated** - Anne had emailed the Presbytery for any contact suggestions but had no reply to date.

#### **News Roundup**

Richard has been in touch with Helping Hands and the Way Ahead Project. Helping Hands have been serving a hot meal every night to feed those who are homeless or temporarily housed. The Way Ahead Project is giving hot drinks and rolls at the door several mornings a week. The LWS shelter is also involved in providing a service.

Help and advice is available from these charities and Richard reported that there is a great need of help to get people rehabilitation — and support to be able to sustain their own tenancies, which is what WDC are working towards. The WAP project manager, Yvonne, also emphasised the need for people to be able to sustain tenancies recently when meeting with the Saturday Friendship Group. Richard was of the view that the charity sector was best placed to help with this support rather than the Council.

Brian reported that numbers at the door at the WAP have dropped recently.

Richard said another problem that will arise soon (after 31<sup>st</sup> December 2020) is that of EU citizens who have not registered in the UK, as they will not be able to access funds, benefits etc. There is a worker from the Refugee Centre who is willing to come and help people in this position to complete the necessary applications. He also asked for information about a fluent Italian speaker who might be able to help an Italian family. There was a suggestion made. Richard also reported that a Polish family have moved into the house run by 3 H in Kenilworth.

**Rosary Intention for August** -- the subject we thought appropriate was that of the work of aid agencies in the developing world and the actual wording to be decided by email.

## 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Hiroshima and Nagasaki

These events are on 6<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> of August and Pax Christi and various events are taking place around the country (Leeds, Liverpool, Coventry, etc) Discussion took place on what we could do/suggest to the clergy. As Father Noel is moving to St Joseph's imminently it is a busy time for them. #### **Season of Creation**

There is a Novena to St Francis which is on the CAFOD website and runs to 9 short pieces based on the Canticles of St Francis. It was suggested that a weekly insert in the newsletter might be possible over 9 weeks starting on the 8/9<sup>th</sup> August and finishing on the 4<sup>th</sup> October. This would be a good way to bring the Season of Creation into everyday work. We will also suggest bidding prayers.
