Dear Parishioners,

Palm Sunday marks the beginning of Holy Week. This week I listened to a reflection on the moment when Jesus arrived in Jerusalem and received a hero's welcome. Our understanding of this event is through the prism of the Gospel, this year we hear the Gospel of St. Mark.

The former professor of the Old Testament at Oscott College, Canon Mervyn Tower, suggested in his reflection that Jerusalem was well used to welcoming famous people and so the lining of the streets and waving of the palms may have been a first for Jesus but for the residents of Jerusalem it was probably a regular event.

For us it is an annual occurrence at our Palm Sunday Mass and an event we look forward to. Unfortunately last year this had to be done behind locked doors, but this year our Masses will be open even if restricted by social distancing, one-way systems, bubbles, hand sanitizer and safety guidelines. Even so the palms will be blessed and distributed at each Mass. This year we have ordered 850 palms at SP & OL and we hope there will be some left over for those who wish to pick one up after Mass on Monday or Tuesday.

The Palm Sunday Mass prepares us for Holy Week. It is like walking through a gateway into the Passion, arrest, torture, interrogation and Crucifixion of our Lord. Recognising that He did this for us and our Salvation should remind us that we are the unworthy recipients of this noble and sacrificial gesture. Our sinfulness is the reason for the death of Jesus. His Resurrection from the dead is the key to our Salvation. This episode is when the lead character in the story is eliminated by the religious authorities. We know their reasons and we know our failures have contributed to his death. We see the fear of the disciples and how they react so differently. The women stay and the men run off!

Try to immerse yourselves in the story of Holy Week, taking each episode for what it is and how it helps us to understand who Jesus was. Whether you attend in person or watch on Live-Stream be there as a hidden spectator and be open to every emotion as the drama unfolds.

### **Review of Holy Week Services:**

**Palm Sunday:** Blessing and Distribution of Palms. The Reading of the Passion according to Mark

**Tuesday:** Live Stream from St. Peter's using Stations of the Cross, Fr. John will lead us in a Penitential Service and our Act of Contrition.

**Wednesday:** 11:30am Live-Stream from St. Chad's Cathedral- The Chrism Mass. As Dean, Fr. John will represent all the Parishes and Pries in the Deanery. Each Priest will renew his Priestly Promises and receive the Oil of the Sick, Oil of Baptism and the Oil of Chrism to assist him in his Priestly Ministries as co-worker with the Bishop.

**Holy Thursday:** 7pm at our 3 Churches. The Easter Triduum is 3 services linked together. The last 3 episodes in the drama opens with the Last Supper, the Institution of the Eucharist. It marks the arrest of Jesus. Our reaction is one of horror.

**Good Friday:** The worst outcome of the drama unfolds as Jesus allows the authorities to do their very worst. He is Crucified. Our reaction is shock.

**Holy Saturday:** The Easter Vigil: We now feel as if we are living through a partial eclipse as the darkness which fell over the land when Jesus died on the Cross makes us feel restless. Our Faith is reaffirmed as we hear the scriptures and the light re-enters the world. If in the Mass bring your torches as we re-enact the coming of the light. (no candles this year as hand sanitiser is highly flammable) The light is the dawn of a new day. Our emotion is expectation & hope.

**Easter Sunday:** The Lord has risen from the dead. Alleluia! Alleluia! Our emotion is joy and our expression is "Alleluia".
