- Finance Comments sent by Michael on the November 2023 Accounts
 In the month we have £ 1,469 available for appeals due to the receipt of our quarterly investment income and slightly higher standard order receipts due to the receipt of some quarterly receipts.

We have had an excellent start to our Christmas voucher appeal with £1,068 received in the first two weeks. This is across all churches so thanks to everyone who made an appeal in the churches.

With the amounts carried forward we have currently £2,370 in the Voucher pot.

We have also banked a further £900 in December. [£ 4,000 of vouchers have been ordered, we may order more later]. This month we paid our auditors bill of £900.

We have issued the Saturday Friendship Group cheques to local charities [Helping Hands, LWS Night Shelter, New Chapters, Foodbank, Young People First] so the balance of £7,000 will disappear in the next month. [£ 413.08 will be added to amounts earmarked for hospitals in Nyenga in Uganda and Ortum in Kenya.]
