Finance - Comments by Michael on the September 2023 Accounts

Our main focus in the month was the appeals for Morocco and Libya. With £ 2,610.04 being donated and £ 2,000 allocated from our gift aid rebate. Allowing £ 2,300 to be sent to each appeal.

During the month we received £ 875 through bank transfers and a donation of £ 1,000 for House of Light and Hope. Additional sums were released for local urgent appeals £ 97.50, £ 130 and £ 200. £ 811.62 is available for appeals.

[£ 123.02 will be added to amounts earmarked for hospitals in Nyenga in Uganda and Ortum in Kenya.]
